

## ATTACHMENT A

Selection criteria for admission to the first-level Master's degree in English

Neuromusculoskeletal Physiotherapy and Exercise Therapy

If the number of candidates exceeds the maximum number established and provided that the minimum requirements are met, admission to the Master's degree is subject to the following evaluation criteria:

- EVALUATION OF QUALIFICATIONS (maximum 20 points according to the following criteria)

degree or DU with top marks and honours: 10 points

degree or DU with a maximum grade: 9 points

degree or DU with a grade from 99 to 109: 8 points

degree or DU with a grade from 88 to 98: 7 points

degree or DU with a grade from 77 to 87: 6 points

degree or DU with a grade from 66 to 76: 5 points

equivalent qualification with maximum grade and honours: 8 points

equivalent qualification with maximum score: 7 points

equivalent qualification with maximum grade and honours: 5 points

equivalent title with maximum grade: 4 points

The same procedure will be adopted for the evaluation of equivalent and equivalent qualifications with a grade lower than 110.

type of percentage reduction provided for a degree or university diploma, even when the titles have a rating expressed in values other than 110.

Master's Degree in "Rehabilitation Sciences of Health Professions" (formerly Specialist Degree in "Rehabilitation Sciences of Health Professions" Rehabilitation): 3 points

PhD: 4 points

Article published in a journal indexed in Cinahl and/or Pubmed: 0.50 points up to a maximum of 3 points.

In case of equal ranking, priority will be given to the score obtained in the written test. If a tie persists, the youngest candidate will prevail.

- WRITTEN TEST (maximum 30 points according to the following criteria)

1 point for each correct answer;

minus 0.2 points for each incorrect answer;

0 points for each unanswered question.

The written test will consist of 30 quizzes in English with multiple choice answers on professional knowledge in Physiotherapy; it will last 45 minutes.
