Article 1 – Admission requirements and enrollment

Tor Vergata University of Rome invites applications for the Master’s Program in ICT and Internet Engineering (Class LM-27, as per Ministerial Decree 270/2004) for the academic year 2025/2026.

- **Eligibility**

Admission to this Master’s program requires meeting specific curricular requirements and demonstrating adequate academic preparation (in accordance with Article 6, Paragraph 2, of Ministerial Decree 270/2004), as detailed in sections A and B below.

Applications are invited from:

1. Italian, EU, and non-EU citizens holding legal residency in Italy, pursuant to Article 26 of Law 189/2002.
2. Non-EU citizens residing outside Italy and requiring a study visa.

Applicants must hold an Italian or an equivalent foreign academic qualification recognized as valid for admission to Master’s programs at Italian universities.

- **A. Curricular requirements**

To be eligible for admission, candidates must meet the following requirements:

1. Hold a three-year Bachelor’s degree (minimum duration) in Information Engineering (L-8) or Industrial Engineering (L-9)
2. Have completed the following minimum ECTS credits (CFU) in specific subject areas:
 - 24 CFU in **Mathematics**, covering any of these areas:
 - Algebra (MAT/02)
 - Geometry (MAT/03)
 - Mathematical Analysis (MAT/05)
 - Probability and Mathematical Statistics (MAT/06)
 - Numerical Analysis (MAT/08)

- Operations Research (MAT/09) – or equivalent courses under the new classification system (MATH-02/A, MATH-02/B, etc., per Ministerial Decree 639 of 02/05/2024)
- 12 CFU in **Physics**, including:
 - Experimental Physics (FIS/01)
 - Matter Physics (FIS/03)
 - Nuclear and Subnuclear Physics (FIS/04) – or equivalent courses (PHYS-01/A, PHYS-03/A, per Ministerial Decree 639 of 02/05/2024)
- 9 CFU in **Telecommunications** (ING-INF/03 or IINF-03/A)
- At least 9 CFU in one of the following:
 - Information Processing Systems (ING-INF/05)
 - Electronics (ING-INF/01)
 - Electromagnetic Fields (ING-INF/02) – or their equivalents under the new classification (IINF-05/A, IINF-01/A, IINF-02/A)
- 3. **For international qualifications:** The degree must be equivalent to a first-cycle degree under the Bologna Process and correspond to Level 6 of the European Qualifications Framework (EQF). It must be issued by a higher education institution that allows progression to second-cycle degrees (Bologna Process/EQF Level 7) in its home country.
- 4. Demonstrate English language proficiency at B2 level or higher

Candidates who do not meet these requirements must complete the necessary coursework before applying. Any required additional credits must be earned before the assessment of academic preparation.

- Enrollment with course abbreviation and possible registration for the second Academic year for 2025/2026 will be POSSIBLE ONLY if the candidate has received recognition for previously completed coursework.

B. Academic preparation assessment

a) **Assessment of individual preparation:** All candidates must undergo an academic preparation assessment through an interview with the Program Coordinator or designated faculty members. This interview evaluates the candidate's knowledge of fundamental subjects relevant to the ICT AND INTERNET ENGINEERING program.

b) **English language proficiency:** Applicants must demonstrate English proficiency at or above the B2 level (Upper-intermediate) of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages

(CEFR). This can be certified by presenting a valid certificate (issued after August 2019) from one of the following accredited institutions:

- Cambridge English Language Assessment
- IELTS
- Trinity College London
- ETS
- TOEIC
- TOEFL iBT
- Pearson EDEXCEL/EDI
- English Speaking Board (ESB)
- Anglia Ascentis Certificate
- Aim Awards (General English/Business English)
- C.C.I examination board (London Chamber of Commerce and Industry)
- British Institutes
- National Qualifications Authority of Ireland – Accreditation and Coordination of English.

Alternatively, applicants may submit a “Proficiency Certificate” issued by their previous university (confirming the required B2 level for admission) together with their GRE® General Test scores. (GRE Designated Institution (DI) Code for the University of Rome Tor Vergata is 3369).

c) An interview with the Program Coordinator

Native English speakers and graduates from English-taught degree programs are exempt from this requirement.

Article 2 – Registration on the Delphi University Portal

All prospective students must register on the University’s [Delphi](#) online portal. The process varies by applicant category:

First Round (International Applicants Requiring Visas)

Application Period: February 10, 2025 - April 30, 2025

Registration procedure for international citizens residing abroad requiring a study visa:

1. Visit the Delphi Platform: <http://delphi.uniroma2.it>

2. Navigate to the Student Area and select “Application to programmes taught in English”. After reviewing the privacy policy, check the box and click “Next”.
3. Select the School of Engineering and then the Master’s Program in ICT AND INTERNET ENGINEERING.
4. Enter the required data and upload the requested documents, in particular:
 - a) Passport or Identity Card (only for EU citizens)
 - b) English Language Certificate or Nationality/Citizenship/Residence certificate.
 - d) (English Language) Proficiency certificate & GRE® General Test Score (as a possible replacement for the above).
 - e) Degree Certificate with the final grade (if already available).
 - f) Official Transcript of Records, including dates and grades for all completed coursework.
5. NOTE THE CTRL - needed to re-enter the menu, modify, cancel or reprint the application;
6. PRINT the application and a €30 assessment fee payment slip;
7. Pay the application fee: Use the PagoPA system, which allows payments through various physical or online channels. Detailed instructions are available at [Payment Methods](#).
8. Confirm the application: Return to the Delphi platform, re-enter the “Request admission to English-taught courses” section, and select the option “You have already filled out the application”. Enter your Tax Code and CTRL code to confirm the application.

Second Round (Italian, EU, and Legally Resident Non-EU Students)

Application Period: May 2, 2025 - March 31, 2026

Registration procedure for Italian, EU, and legally resident non-EU students in Italy:

1. Visit <http://delphi.uniroma2.it> – Student Section
2. Select “BUTTON 1 - Curricular requirements verification request” > read the “More information” note and select “a. Complete the application” > “in-person study program” > select your program of interest;
3. After reading the privacy notice, select the box and click “next”;
4. Select the School of Engineering; then: select the program with the deadline indicated in the chosen period > select “unreserved places”;
5. ENTER the requested data;
6. ENTER DEGREE data (click “DEGREE BY EXAMINATION”) and complete all mandatory fields;

7. Once the requested data is entered, click NEXT > a list of curricular requirements will be presented to complete:
 - “OTHER DEGREE” – to enter another degree
 - “OTHER TRAINING COURSES”, “CURRENT WORK ACTIVITY” or “PREVIOUS WORK ACTIVITY”
 - “POST-GRADUATE COURSE”
 - “EXAMINATION TAKEN” – (always select YES) - enter details for all examinations from your degree curriculum if graduated from another university
8. NOTE THE CTRL - needed to re-enter the menu, modify, cancel or reprint the application
9. PRINT the application with the list of declared qualifications and examinations and the €30 assessment fee payment slip
10. PAY through the PagoPA system
11. VALIDATE the application

IMPORTANT NOTES (Applicable to all ROUNDS):

- The €30 assessment fee is non-refundable
- The following students are exempt from the €30 fee but must still validate their application:
 - Students with disabilities of 66% or higher or with recognition under Article 3, Paragraph 1 of Law no. 104 of February 5, 1992
 - Students graduated from Tor Vergata University with a grade of at least 100/110
- The curricular requirements evaluation will only be activated after validation of the application on the Delphi system

The Program Coordinator or the Master’s Degree Program Committee will promptly evaluate applications and make decisions regarding the adequacy of curricular requirements.

Candidates will receive notification of the evaluation outcome via email at the address provided in their Delphi registration.

Article 3 – Pre-enrollment procedure

Applicants who have successfully completed the mandatory registration on the Delphi platform (as outlined in Article 2) and received a positive evaluation of their academic requirements can pre-enroll from **May 12, 2025 to July 14, 2025**.

STEPS:

1. Access the University's online Services website: <http://delphi.uniroma2.it>;
2. Select Student Area > Button 2 > “Pre-enrollment” > button a. > “fill in the application” > select the School and the degree program of interest, enter the required data, and follow the instructions provided;
3. Pay the pre-enrollment fee of €156.00;
4. The payment must be made through the PagoPa system, which allows payment through a variety of channels. Further information on payment methods is available at the following link: <http://studenti.uniroma2.it/pagamento/>;
5. Carefully retain the CTRL identification code issued during the pre-enrollment procedure. This code, together with your Tax code, will allow you to recover your data for direct enrollment.

PLEASE NOTE: Non-EU citizens requiring a study visa may complete pre-enrollment (or enrollment; see below) only after receiving their visa.

Article 4 – Enrollment procedure

Only students who have obtained their qualifying degree as specified in Art.1 and received positive evaluation of their curricular requirements may enroll during these periods:

- **FIRST ROUND: July 15, 2025 to November 6, 2025**
- **SECOND ROUND: July 15, 2025 to March 31, 2026**

Important notes:

- Upon enrollment, the first installment of tuition fees (€156.00) is due. This payment is waived if it was already made during the pre-enrollment phase.
- Pre-enrollment is not mandatory. It is an option for applicants who have not yet obtained their Italian degree or an equivalent international qualification recognized under current regulations, or for those who wish to secure their place before July 15, 2025.
- For further information regarding non-EU citizens requiring a study visa, please refer to Article 7 of this Call.

Article 5 – Tuition fees

Details about tuition fees and payment deadlines will be provided in the 2025/2026 Student Guide, accessible at <http://web.uniroma2.it/> and <http://studenti.uniroma2.it/>

The Student Guide will also include information for full or partial exemptions (*) from the payment of tuition fees.

(*) In particular, a 10% reduction on the first-year tuition fee is offered to students who graduated from Tor Vergata University of Rome or another Italian University with a final grade of 110/110.

Article 6 – Transfers, change of program, and course shortenings

The procedures described in this notice also apply to transfers from other universities or program changes within Tor Vergata University to the Master’s Degree in ICT and Internet Engineering. For both transfers and transitions, once enrollment clearance is granted, students must initiate the appropriate process as outlined on the online services portal (<http://delphi.uniroma2.it>) and detailed in the 2025/2026 Student Guide (published on the University website: <http://web.uniroma2.it>).

Article 7 – Students with foreign academic qualifications and non-EU students requiring a visa

International students holding foreign academic qualifications who have completed the procedures referred to in Article 2 of this notice, must proceed with the pre-enrollment and/or enrollment referred to in Articles 3 and 4 of this notice, following the instructions available at the following links:

Foreign entry qualifications:

To be admitted to the two-year Master’s Degree Program, the following documentation is required:

- **Original final academic qualification**, recognized as valid under Italian law and the regulations established by the Italian Ministry of University and Research (MUR).
- **Transcript of Records**, issued by the awarding university and certifying the exams taken, or Diploma Supplement (if applicable).
- **Country-specific documentation**: additional specific documents may be required depending on the country where the qualification was obtained.

PLEASE NOTE: Universities, under Article 2 of Law 148/2002 and subsequent amendments, are autonomous in determining the documentation required for enrollment. Consequently, Tor Vergata University of Rome reserves the right to request additional documents if deemed necessary.

Study visa application procedure:

Non-EU students residing abroad must complete the pre-enrollment procedure on the University platform (www.university.it) by **31 July 2025**. When completing the pre-enrollment application, it is mandatory to upload the documentation described in this Article.

The University will confirm the pre-enrollment application, after which the candidate must contact the Italian diplomatic or consular authorities to submit the required documents within the deadlines established by the MUR. These deadlines can be found at: <https://www.studiare-in-italia.it/studenti stranieri/>.

Please note:

- Issuing the visa is solely the responsibility of the competent Italian diplomatic or consular authorities.
- Enrollment procedures for the chosen program will be finalized after the study visa is granted, provided that the submitted documentation is verified for authenticity and compliance with admission requirements.

Completion of enrollment:

International students with foreign academic qualifications and visa applicants must complete their enrollment through the **International Students Office:**

During this phase:

1. Enrollment will be confirmed, and a student identification number (matricola) will be assigned.
2. The International Students Office will verify the authenticity of the submitted documentation. If the said documentation is incomplete or does not meet the requirements, admission will be invalidated.

The places reserved for non-EU citizens residing abroad and requiring a visa for the academic year 2025/2026 are distributed as follows:

Non-EU students who hold a valid residence permit and have obtained their academic qualifications from an Italian university must complete their enrollment at the Student Affairs Office of the School of Engineering.

Article 8 – Support for students with Disabilities or Specific Learning Disorders (SLD)

Declaration of Disability or SLD

Students with a certified disability (equal to or greater than 66%) or with recognition of a handicap under Article 3 of Law 104/1992, as well as students diagnosed with Specific Learning Disorders (SLD) under Law 170/2010, must declare their status during registration on the Delphi platform (refer to Article 2 of this notice).

Submission of certifications

1. **Italian students:**

○ Certifications for civil disability and/or recognition of handicap (Law 104/1992) must be submitted in **PDF format** via email to the CARIS Office at segreteria@caris.uniroma2.it.

2. **International students:**

○ Students residing abroad must send their certification, accompanied by an official sworn translation into Italian or English, issued by the competent Italian embassy, certifying their disability or SLD status.

The CARIS Office will evaluate the suitability of the certifications and notify the applicant via email.

Exemption and fee reduction requests

At the time of enrollment, students requesting **total or partial exemption from tuition fees** or additional support services provided by CARIS must:

1. Indicate their status during registration on the Delphi platform.
2. Submit valid certifications to the CARIS Office through one of the following methods:
 - By email in **PDF format** to segreteria@caris.uniroma2.it.

- In person at the CARIS Office (as specified below).

All sensitive documents will be handled by the CARIS Office in compliance with applicable privacy regulations.

Details of fee exemptions and reductions

1. Full exemption:

- Students with a disability of 66% or higher, or with recognition of a handicap under Article 3, Law 104/1992, are fully exempt from tuition fees.
- These students must follow the standard online enrollment process for all students but are also required to self-certify their disability in their application.

2. 20% reduction on second installment:

- Students with a disability recognized between **46% and 65%** may request a 20% reduction on the second installment of tuition fees.
- Students with a certified SLD (Specific Learning Disorder) are also eligible to request this reduction, following the same procedure.

Requests for compensatory tools and dispensatory measures

During their studies, students with disabilities or SLD may request compensatory tools or dispensatory measures for their courses and/or exams. These requests must be submitted in writing to the CARIS Office.

SLD Certification requirements:

The certification for SLD must meet the following criteria:

- Be issued by the National Health Service or by specialists/accredited centers authorized by regional regulations.
- Be comprehensive and explicit, including references to nosographic codes and a clear indication of the diagnosed SLD (e.g., reading, writing, or calculation difficulties).
- Comply with the guidelines of Law 170/2010, the 2011 Consensus Conference and subsequent amendments, as well as the 2012 State-Regions Conference guidelines as implemented by each region.
- For students from the Lazio region, consult the dedicated SLD section at <https://www.salutelazio.it/disturbi-specifici-di-apprendimento-dsa>.

Important notes:

1. The University reserves the right to verify the authenticity of all declarations and certifications submitted.

2. False declarations, forged documents, or misuse of such documents are subject to penalties under the Italian Penal Code and relevant laws.
3. Failure to submit complete and valid documentation will result in the student being liable for the full amount of university tuition fees.
