C. Pedagogical project

The objective of this blended course (divided between an online segment and a final in-person session) is to offer participating students the opportunity to reflect on the benefits associated with a comparative and transnational approach to European history.

D. Online activities

The online activities will take place from April 23 to May 28, 2025. This virtual component will include reflections on key themes in European history and historiography, providing a foundation for the in-person sessions.

E. Onsite activities

All in-person activities will be held at the University of Belgrade from June 9 to June 13. The in-person summer school will build upon insights gained during the online sessions, and students will also have the opportunity to present their own research.

F. Associated ECTS

Each participant will receive an attendance certificate.

The course workload is 3 ECTS and it can be validated through a Learning Agreement.

2. Funding and scholarships

The project is founded by ERASMUS+ and students from the University of Rome Tor Vergata will have a scholarship to cover the costs related to the short-term physical mobility. All the students enrolled in a bachelor, master, single cycle or PhD for the academic year 2024-2025 are eligible for the scholarship.

The project is funded by ERASMUS+ and students at the University of Rome Tor Vergata will receive a grant to cover the costs of short-term physical mobility. All students enrolled in a bachelor, master degree or single-cycle degree for the academic year 2024-2025 are eligible for the scholarship.

Students participating in the mobility will receive the following grants:

The University of Rome Tor Vergata provides for the recognition of specific travel grants to support for physical mobility carried out at partner institutions within the framework of the Erasmus BIPs. These contributions travel grants, in implementation of the Erasmus+ 2021-2027 Programme, are aimed at encouraging international student mobility for students with fewer opportunities.

The subsidy for the travel, according to the Programme Guide, is calculated on the basis of unit cost scales for distance bands. The distance band refers to a single leg of the travel while the corresponding tariff covers both the outward and the return flight.

The contribution is recognized up to the amount indicated in the table below:

Travel distances	Amount for travel
From 10 to 99 KM	€ 28,00
From 100 to 499 KM	€ 211,00
From 500 to 1999 KM	€ 309,00
From 2000 to 2999 KM	€ 395,00
From 3000 to 3999 KM	€ 580,00
From 4000 to 7999 KM	€ 1.188,00
8000 KM or more	€ 1.735,00

3. Application requirement and evaluation requirements

BIP Application requirements for Tor Vergata students:

- Application deadline is scheduled for: **April 22, 2025, (12.00)**
- Applicants have to be enrolled at the University of Rome Tor Vergata in a bachelor or master or single cycle degree or a doctoral course/PhD program (in Italian or in English) at the time of application and at the school time must be enrolled in the university at the time of submission of the application and during the period of the school
- English language requirements: English level B2
- Complete the application form and attach a letter of motivation (max. 250 words) as well as a current certificate of study.
