C. Pedagogical project

The main objective is to provide scientific support and networking to doctoral students from the partner institutions in the field of research of Kant and German Idealism studies on a regular basis.

This BIP consists in a blended intensive seminar. Its field comprehends both (i) approaches of the period of German philosophy from Kant to Hegel from the perspective of the history of philosophy, and (ii) approaches assessing the heritage, influence and renewal and reappraisal of this period in the current

discussions in diverse systematic domains of philosophy (for instance in practical philosophy since John Rawls).

The contents of the BIP consist in three parts, each related to the field of “Kant and German idealism” studies:

1. a topic. This BIP will be devoted to the relationship between Kant and German Idealism, on the one hand, and the Enlightenment, on the other hand.
2. The interpretation of two texts from that period. Previous texts included excerpts by authors such as Kant, Hegel, Fichte, Herder, Schleiermacher etc. This BIP will handle texts from Maimon and Hegel criticizing the Kantian methodical approach and goal in theoretical philosophy. (The texts in English and German versions will be sent in advance to the participants).
3. The presentation and discussion of individual doctoral projects of the participants on any topic of the broad field of “Kant and German Idealism” .

D. Online activities

The online activities will be scheduled on July 24th and 25th, 2025.

E. Onsite activities

All the activities in presence will be organized University of Vechta from June 10st to June 14th, 2025.

F. Associated ECTS

Each participant will receive an attendance certificate.

The course workload is 3 ECTS and it can be validated through a Learning Agreement.

2. Funding and scholarships

The project is founded by ERASMUS+ and students from the University of Rome Tor Vergata will have a scholarship to cover the costs related to the short-term physical mobility. All the students enrolled in a bachelor, master, single cycle or PhD for the academic year 2024-2025 are eligible for the scholarship.

The University of Rome Tor Vergata provides for the recognition of specific travel grants to support for physical mobility carried out at partner institutions within the framework of the Erasmus BIPs. These contributions travel grants, in implementation of the Erasmus+ 2021- 2027 Programme, are aimed at encouraging international student mobility for students with fewer opportunities.

The subsidy for the travel, according to the Programme Guide, is calculated on the basis of unit cost scales for distance bands. The distance band refers to a single leg of the travel while the corresponding tariff covers both the outward and the return flight.

The contribution is recognized up to the amount indicated in the table below:
