2. Funding and scholarships

The Tor Vergata University of Rome provides for the recognition of specific travel grants to support for physical mobility carried out at partner institutions within the framework of the Erasmus BIPs. These contributions travel grants, in implementation of the Erasmus+ 2021-2027 Programme, are aimed at encouraging international student mobility for students with fewer opportunities.

The subsidy for the travel, according to the Programme Guide, is calculated on the basis of unit cost scales for distance bands. The distance band refers to a single leg of the travel while the corresponding tariff covers both the outward and the return flight.

The contribution is recognised up to the amount indicated in the table below:

3. Application requirement and evaluation requirements

BIP Application requirements for Tor Vergata students:

- The academic career will be evaluated as of: October 30th, 2025
- Application deadline is scheduled for: October 30th, 2025 (12.00)
- The academic career to be considered includes the average GPA of the Bachelor's, Master's, and single-cycle degree programs, as well as the final grade of the Master's or single-cycle degree for PhD student.
- Applicants must be enrolled at the University of Rome Tor Vergata in a Bachelor's, Master's, single-cycle degree, or PhD program (either in Italian or in English) at the time of application, and must remain enrolled until March 10th, 2026.
- English language requirement: English B2
- Motivation letter (max. 250 words)

Please note: students who have participated in previous editions of the Arctic Winter School are not eligible to apply for this call.
